

DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

Clarence Acox and I founded SRJO in 1995, hiring our favorite musicians, using musical scores from our own personal collections, and paying for all of that out of our own back pockets. We rented fine concert halls and guaranteed the musicians a fair fee for their time, both rehearsing and performing, regardless of the financial losses we might suffer if our shows did not sell. These things set us apart from many



arts groups and from most other jazz bands in our region, and we have stayed with these policies through thick and thin.

With the help of many friends, donors, government agencies, and a dedicated board of directors, we grew quickly into a licensed, full-fledged 501(c)3 non-profit arts organization with a professional staff to keep things running smoothly, and to keep service to our customers and community at the center of all we do.

Now, after 27 years of remarkable success, SRJO has finally reached the point in its organizational development where we can hire a new administrator to take over the role of Executive Director, so that I can finally focus all of my time and energy on being the Artistic Director. As you probably know, I have worked in both roles for our entire history, and while this made some aspects of the organization run more smoothly, there has always been too little time to do both jobs.

We are now busy interviewing candidates for the Executive Director position. By the time you read this, I hope we will be very near the decision of choosing the right person to fill that role and carry us into the future with new inspiration and skills. I'm excited to see who that new person will be, and I'm sure many of you feel the same.

THIS MESSAGE IS A TRIBUTE to all of you who have supported SRJO as ticket buyers, subscribers, friends and donors for these many years. It is also a tribute to my dear, life-long

friend Clarence Acox, who has decided to take this opportunity to retire as Co-Artistic Director. He will now hold the honorary title of Co-Founder and Emeritus Artistic Director.

I want all of us to take time to reflect on the legacy Clarence has given to SRJO, and to the entire jazz culture of our city and region. Without his efforts and inspired leadership, SRJO would not exist. In fact, a great deal of the entire jazz culture in Seattle, with its many top-flight bands, excellent education programs and superstar musicians. would not exist.

So, please help me to make this 2022-23 SRJO concert series a celebration of who we have become, and the profound contributions of everyone who worked to get us here, especially Clarence. As we enter a new era of organizational strength and maturity, let us also celebrate how happy we are to pass the joy of jazz music to future generations.

Ellington composed "Reminiscing in Tempo" during the summer of 1935 as a heart-felt response to the death of his beloved mother, Daisy Ellington, in May of that year. The piece was a breakthrough work for Ellington and is often regarded as the most ambitious jazz composition to be created up to that time, requiring all four sides of two 78-rpm records. Our performance of *Reminiscing* is made possible by SRJO artistic director Michael Brockman's careful note-for-note transcription of the unpublished Ellington score from the original 1935 vintage recording. Other jazz classics from Ellington and his peers are featured and award-winning vocalist (and SRJO audience favorite) Jacqueline Tabor joins us as well, performing some great hits from this golden era of jazz.













We are very pleased to welcome flugelhornist Dmitri Matheny to our stage. Acclaimed for his warm tone, soaring lyricism, and masterful technique, Matheny has been lauded as "one of the most emotionally expressive improvisers of his generation" (International Review of Music). An honors graduate of Berklee College of Music, Matheny vaulted onto the 1990s jazz scene as a protege of jazz legend Art Farmer. He has toured extensively throughout the US, Europe, and Asia, and has over 100 recordings to his credit along with 12 albums released as a leader.

Favorite selections will include *Desafinado* by Antonio Carlos Jobim, *Stormy Weather* by Harold Arlen and *Stolen Moments* by Oliver Nelson, plus special pieces from Dmitri's acclaimed 2022 album *Cascadia*.

We'll also welcome "rising stars" from local high schools to join us on stage and strut their stuff!

Clarence Acox Jazz Scholars

Since 2009, SRJO has operated its unique Jazz Scholars program, partnering with local schools to provide free music lessons by SRJO's artists and SRJO-authorized teachers, plus free instruments to kids in under-served music programs.

COVID restrictions in the schools meant that most of our teaching moved online, with our instructors using many innovative methods to personalize teaching for kids of all backgrounds. With COVID restrictions now lifted, we are back at it with in-person instruction in ten underserved Seattle schools, and the kids are more enthusiastic than ever about the opportunity to work with SRJO's professional teachers. SRJO's highly successful education programs have proven to be resilient, and we continue to make a difference in the lives of kids who need it.





Music can be the doorway to creative thinking, self-esteem and self-expression, and SRJO is dedicated to keeping the art of jazz thriving among youth.

Jazz4Kids Concerts

Jazz4Kids concerts are free to all kids and families, with special outreach to underserved communities. As part of its mission, SRJO promotes love for jazz in young people so this special music will continue as a significant artistic example of the strength of American diversity and creativity. Jazz4Kids concerts bring the experience and sound of big band jazz to the next generation in state-of-the-art concert halls. The concerts are interactive, and include a question-and-answer time with the band members. Kids learn about all the instruments through a "meet-the-orchestra" demonstration during shows and, when possible, an instrument "petting zoo" in the lobby.
